NEW OF RECENT ACTIVITIES & PLANS FROM MIKE

With the bird nesting season upon us our task day activities have recently changed from the winter removal of woody material with associated bonfires to infrastructure maintenance; mainly fence repairs, gate/stile repairs and step maintenance. We have recently repaired the horse fencing along the top of the hill to help keep riders on the bridleway and off where the man orchids grow. We have also helped cut material which will be used in the Red Earth installation. This material we would have removed anyway so we just collected it rather than burned it. We will have a task day to move this on 6th May and for those of you who are interested the Red Earth team will be starting the construction the week beginning 9th May, details as per the website.

Unfortunately we have been unable to source a leader for the butterfly walk this year so it is with regret that this has had to be cancelled but with the hope that we can reinstate it next year. The bird walk and the National Trust orchid walk will however go ahead.

Task days continue through until the end of July and everybody is welcome young and old, no booking is necessary, just turn up at the appointed time/destination. I know that not everyone can always make a full day so come out for an hour when you can, all help is greatly appreciated. For those of you who are less physical we are always looking for people to help with the admin side of the group.

BIRD WALK - 2011

We write to inform you of the forthcoming annual Friends of Wolstonbury Bird Walk on the hill. It takes place on Saturday 14th may, when we shall meet at the west end of Pyecombe Street (Map reference 284128) at 08:30 am.

This year our guide Bob Miles of Brighton RSPB Members Group will lead us first onto the west side of the hill. We don't expect lots of rarities, but have seen in previous years Chaffinch, Blackcap, Whitethroat, Garden Warbler, meadow Pipit and Skylark, and heard brilliant song from more common birds like Song Thrush, Blackbird, Robin, Wren, Blue and Great Tit and Green Woodpecker at different spots during the walk. We're having a later start than the dawn Chorus to make it easier for you to attend. We also expect to see early flowering spring flowers such as Man and Early Purple Orchid. If the weather is reasonable this will make a fine outing.
